

Did you Know? (submitted by Patty Girman)

A thirty-something woman from Alabama was visiting friends in New York city during the winter. While on a streetcar, trying to see the sites of the city, she noticed that the driver was having a tough time trying to see through the snow and sleet that was accumulating on the windshield. He would occasionally stop the streetcar and hop out and use his hand to clear the window. The front window was a split window and at times he would just stick his head out to be able to see. This meant that with the front window open the snow and wind would whip through the streetcar, making it even colder and more miserable for the passengers.

This woman was sidetracked from her city sight-seeing by watching the driver and his predicament. This was the early 1900's and


streetcars, automobiles and horse and carriages were all sharing the road. Matter of fact, cars weren't very plentiful yet and folks driving horse and carriages were quite used to having wind and weather blowing in their faces. Mary Anderson grew up in Alabama and had spent time in her 20's operating a cattle ranch and vineyards in Fresno, California. Dealing with weather like this was new to her. She pulled out a pad of paper and started working on an idea she had to help with this windshield dilemma. How could the driver clear the window from the inside without having to open the window or stop and get out? She thought about how a squeegee was used to clean windows and how she could incorporate that idea into a device for cars and streetcars. Her device consisted of a wipe arm on the outside that was attached to a lever on the inside that dragged a spring-loaded arm across the window. This device could be removed during nicer weather. In 1903, she received a patent for her "window cleaning device". She tried to sell her idea, but no one wanted to hear about it. Remem-

ber, cars were new. The Ford Model T car was not even manufactured until 1908. Cars didn't go very fast, so why would they need this. And besides that, many thought this was a bad idea as the movement of the wiper blade would be a distraction to the driver and most likely could cause an accident. Her patent expired in 1920 without being sold to anyone. She gave up trying to sell it early on as it just wasn't an excepted idea. However, by 1916 these wipers were standard equipment on most cars and a Ford accessory on the Model T in 1924. It wasn't until the 1950's that automobile safety really became a priority. Mary died in 1953 having seen her invention evolve, but never making a penny on her idea.

Dress in vintage preferred but optional.


