

East Central Manhattan Kansas T's MTFCA National Tour June 18-23, 2023

What a treat to be greeted by mild sunny weather for the entire tour; arriving at the trailer parking, then met by helpers to unload our luggage.

The next evening, Sunday, we drove to the *Midwest Dream Car Collection* where we enjoyed a reception dinner and viewed their collection which included a 1948 Ford Super Deluxe Woodie StationWagon, 23 windows in a Volkswagon bus, a 1963 split window Chevrolet Corvette, a 1984 DeLoren DMC-12, and a 2010 Tesla Roadster Sport.

In the *photos on the next page* - starting at the upper to lower left:

Windmill in the tallgrass prairies and bouvine from the farms;

the photo below that is the fascinating story of a 43 year old Frenchman, Emile Leray. In 1993, he took a roadtrip in his Citroen 2CV from the city of Tan-Tan to Zagoa, Morocco. Evading police orders to return to Tan-Tan (due to unrest in the area ahead), he veered off the road in an attempt to continue on by crossing the Morrocan Sahara desert. He was driving too fast, hit a large rock and destroyed the chassis, a control arm, and the front axel. With limited food and water, he came up with an idea to take all salvagable parts including nuts and bolts because he had few tools and no ability to weld, he cleverly decided to build a motorcycle out of his car parts. After 12 days and 11 nights the project was completed and tested. The photo shown is one of the photos he took. He then continued on his journey now returning to Tan-Tan. The actual motorcycle is on display in front of the photo he took. The photo below is of the cars Sonny & Cher commissioned; and below them is a nod to the wine country - a car decorated in corks.

On the upper right photos shown are:

The back and front views of an 1886 Benz Patent-Motorwagen which can reach 10 mph, single-cylinder four-stroke engine, world's first gasoline powered production automobile

Below that is a outside and inside view of a 1925 Rolls-Royce Silver Ghost Salamanca collapsible which has been in movies. The chauffeur's open air compartment is divided from the passenger area with retractible glass. The enclosed passenger cabin can be open to the sky by folding the top back. A microhone is used to communicate with the driver; and for the lady there is a vanity, and mirror, and for the gentleman a cigar lighter and ashtray, and, of course, a clock.

Below the Rolls-Royce is a 1923 Ford Model T Runabout "Old Liz"

Some of the ladies attending Wednesday night's Ladies Tea in vintage attire.

And the photo at bottom right is "Valentino" showing off a ribbon with a medal hanging from the motometer over the radiator, won for being the fastest car to race across the prairie roads clocked at 44 mph with driver Richard Chuck, and their car banner number was #44.

Monday the tour was to a lake with a fabulous lunch at Wild Olives Restaurant. A cheese factory stop, and a visit to heritage park.

Tuesday: A visit to the Oz Museum with all the movie memorabilia, next a pioneer town, and the Oregon Trail life size bronze oxen and wagon.

Wednesday: We visited the Eisenhower home and museum in Abilene, while car games took place, and in the evening the ladies in vintage dress attended a Tea and a presentation.

Thursday: We visited Fort Riley with viewing of the General Custer Home, First Territorial capital, U.S. Cavalry Museum (just opened), and the Commanding General's Mounted Color Guard Steeds, and we enjoyed a delicious box lunch

Friday: We did a car show at the park and then attended the evening banquet dressed in vintage attire.


