

Best selling vehicle in '22? It was a FORD

Model T set a record with over a million sales

The <u>Ford F-Series</u> marked 40 consecutive years as America's best-selling vehicle last year and will almost certainly retain the title in 2022, just like a Ford did in 1922.



The 1922 Ford Model T was the first to rack up over one million sales. (Ken R Morris Jr)

That year the revolutionary Model T became the first vehicle to surpass one million sales in a calendar year, with <u>over 1.3 million</u> delivered globally.

Like the <u>F-Series</u>, the Model T line comprised several variants, although they ranged from cars to trucks.


