

Car Show at Creekside Rehabilitation & Behavioral Health

While admiring the cars, one lady said that she was born in 1928 (making her 91 this year) and that, as a child, she remembers her Grandfather driving a Model T. He would have been born circa 1880s-1890s, saved-up to buy (luxury) a Model T at age 35-55. These cars will outlive us too!

The attendees were treated to a delicious lunch of hamburger, potato salad, carrot raisin salad, watermelon, and beverages.

Safer Because of the Safe T Check

The Safe **T** Check is an annual event that is intended to help us prepare our Model T's for the upcoming touring season. What could be better, a professional Model T inspection and a pot luck meal to go along with it.

The inspection was a great opportunity to bring April out for the first time in two years. April, our 1924 Model T Coupe, was sidelined with a bent connecting rod on the way to the 2017 pancake breakfast at the Nelsons. Thinking everything was in tiptop shape, I proudly presented April for the inspection. Chris Rich greeted me at the door to the Hasse's barn and was crazy enough to stand in front of the car to guide me into the inspection bay. He had more confidence that I could stop than I did. Thankfully, the brakes did work and Chris didn't have anything to worry about. Pete Rich prepared the check-off form and instinctively knew the correct model number and year of my car. My car was ready for the formal inspection. Ted Shimkowski and Chris Rich proceeded to poke and prod all of April's nuts, bolts, tires and cotter pins. To my chagrin, Chris and Ted started shouting out names and numbers, similar to an Oil Stop visit. Pete could hardly write fast enough and I couldn't believe the huge number of items Chris and Ted were calling out. Chris and Ted were very thorough and noticed items I had never thought about such as:

olack of lock washers on all four Rocky Mountain brake nuts
ofront perch nuts loose
obrake light didn't work
osteering shaft loose
ofan pulley had way too much movement
ocrankcase arm blocks, broken and missing
othe list continued . . .

Needless to say, I questioned whether it was safe to drive home with all of these things marked on my sheet, but Pete assured me the car might make it home.

The first thing I did was to get on the Model T Forum on the Internet to look up what the items were. Who ever heard of a front perch or a broken wooden crankcase arm block? I immediately put in my order to Snyder's for the required parts and made a special trip to the local hardware store for lock washers and cotter pins.

Day one of my repairs, I did all of the easy things such as installing lock washers, and cotter pins in the castle nuts, then tightening bolts. A piece of cake.

Day two, I tackled a few more complicated items, replacing a fuse in the brake lighting circuit, and looking at the excessive movement in the fan pulley. After a few hours of investigation, it turned out that the fan tension bracket thingy was installed backwards and would not let the fan pulley tighten up. After turning this bracket the correct direction the fan pulley tightened up just like it was supposed to.

Day three, the parts I ordered had arrived so I tackled the last items, replacing the wooden crankcase arm blocks. I anticipated having to do all sorts of heroic tasks such as removing the engine, etc. The job went relatively easy and only required a slight modification of the standard blocks to work. It turns out that 1924 had different wood block designs every few months it seems. With help from my grandson Kris, and some never to be duplicated contortions, we were able to get the holes back into alignment and the screws properly secured. It turned out the vertical and horizontal, bolts which were on the car, were the wrong size and needed to be replaced.

With all of these items corrected, what will they find next year??

Thank You Pete, Chris, and Ted for thoroughly checking, and keeping us all safer.

Thank You Dave and Sherry Haase for hosting the event at your beautiful property.
