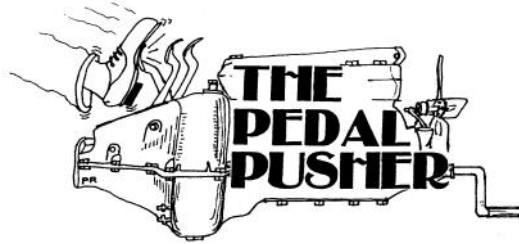

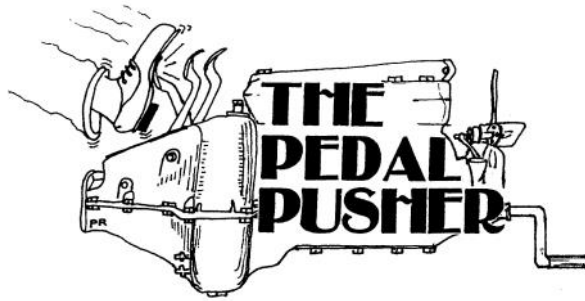

Driver - \$290

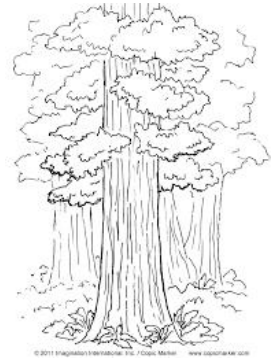
Passenger - \$240
