



He will begin collecting your treasures in October.

Chris Rich reported that we have had 25 years of safe driving! This is probably due to the Safety Check each year, and your good follow-up car care. Based on things found at the safety check, Chris offered this reminder:

For less wheel wobble, Keep demountable rim bolt nuts tightened using 35 to 40 lb torque

Check that all cotter pins or lock washers are in place including underneath

Front end loose-Check king pins, and the drag link bushing Loose steering-check the rivets where the head goes into the column

Check the bolts that go thru the pan to the frame both lateral and horizontal-this keeps the engine straight which keeps the front end straight. Check the front and rear shackle bolts for lock washers or cotter pins.

New Business: George Jones reported that Clare Pearson wants to donate a First Aid kit but she would like to be paid for the EpiPen.

Don Johnson proposed the motion for the vote, and Robin Summerfield seconded that motion. A vote was taken and carried.

Thank you Chris Rich for the dessert.

Meeting adjourned at 7:40 p.m.

Hostess, Dot told the story of her teacup. It was her great-grandmother's. We supposed that it was the oldest cup at the tea.


