Jimtown & Them Sum Tour

On 10/18, Dave & Mici Ryberg put on a wonderful tour up the Alexander Valley to the Jimtown store. The old Jimtown store and restaurant had been sold some time ago, so it's now under new ownership and this was the first time our group visited the new establishment. There were 7 cars that participated in the tour, and we met at the park across from Cardinal Newman High School. The weather was picture perfect.

The drive up into the Alexander Valley is always so picturesque, and Saturday was no exception. The vineyards were starting to change to fall colors and warm temperatures. The drive took a little over a half-hour to arrive at Jimtown, where the group took a lunch break, sat outside, and enjoyed the scenery while we all ate. Upon finishing lunch, a group photo-op was conducted in front of the store. Afterwards, we drove west on Litton Springs Rd., crossing under the freeway and taking us into the Dry Creek Valley towards the general store on Dry Creek Rd.

Dave had planned out a specific route, but folks were told they could choose whatever route back home that suited their needs. Dianna and I chose to continue up Dry Creek Rd. to the Kokomo winery where we needed to pick up some wines, only to have our car stall upon pulling into the parking lot. Before I could begin to assess why the car had stalled, we were greeted by numerous folks that were wine tasting. They were thrilled to see the Model T, and proceeded to ask numerous questions. Not wanting to be rude, we gladly answered all their questions, while in the back of my mind I kept wondering,

After everyone left, I got back in the car and it instantly started, much to my amazement. So we took care of our business at Kokomo and proceeded to drive home on West Side Rd. only to go about 4-5 miles when suddenly the car lost all power, and we coasted to the side of the road. Not knowing if the problem was fuel or spark related, I checked out the carburetor and confirmed it had fuel, but repeated attempts at starting the car were unsuccessful. About this time I was getting worried, and figured I might need Steve Vining to come rescue us with his flatbed trailer. I gave it one more try, and upon switching the ignition to magneto, the car instantly started. I switched back to battery and it continued to run well, so we climbed in and took off only to have it stall again about 2-3 miles down the road. After the car sat a couple of minutes and further checks didn't reveal any obvious problems, I tried starting the car and it started instantly. So we took off again and thankfully it continued to run and took us all the way back to Rohnert Park without problems. Thankfully we were back home again.

I parked the car, figuring I needed time to relax before seeing what ails it. Like we always say, driving a Model T is "an adventure" and we were happy to be back home again without having to bother anyone to rescue us.
